Well I hate to sound old...but this year sure is off to a flying start! Thank you again for your prayers and support as we serve the Lord on Nauru, we couldn't be here without you!

Saturday February 22nd we had our first Men's Breakfast for the year, Bro Simpson shared a practical lesson about the Nauru Police Force, and I gave a devotion about how real men need to Praise the Lord. We had a good group of men and boys present.

March 16th we had our first special day for the year, Police Force Day. We gave out flyers to all the 80some members of the Nauru Police Force inviting them to come to Sunday Morning Services and honoring them for their service of the Government and people of Nauru. We were disappointed to only have 2 police officers present, but were thankful for those who came.

Chris, who I mentioned last letter, was out of hospital briefly and came to Thursday night Bible Study, but was back in hospital before he could make it to Sunday Services. He is on regular dialysis and a breathing machine. Please pray for his renewed health and spiritual growth.

We had some recent visa changes under the current Nauru government that had us abit nervous about renewing our visas. The Business visa that we were on went from \$500 a year, to \$6000! To make a long story short we were able to get a Religious Business Visa, and all was renewed for free! Praise the Lord for his provision!

March 30th we had 5th Sunday Fellowship, with dinner on the grounds and afternoon service. The flu kept attendance low, but the healthy ones there had a good time and plenty to eat. Bro Simpson preached in the afternoon service about "Redeeming the Time".

We are thankful the Missions giving continues to do well, and for a few visitors, Gordon, Drago, Amos and Esther who came in the last few months.

It's been a Wet 'n Wild start to the year for us weather wise. Strong westerly winds brought plenty of rain and rough seas that damaged the port moorings so that cargo and fuel ships were delayed unloading. We are out of flour and petrol at the moment, but thankfully, not rice. I joke that Nauruan's get grouchy if they don't eat rice at least once a day.
